FS1 We have had yet another wonderful week in Nursery! We have been super busy learning all about poetry specifically limericks for Poetry Week here at East Garforth, Nursery were amazing at learning and reciting their limerick! In maths the children have been counting superstars and have learnt to touch each object as they count, they did a wonderful job at counting the ghosts haunting our classroom! We have also enjoyed our first stay and play this week with lots of grown up's joining in the fun, we would like to send a special thank you to all those that attended and we can't wait for the next one. We are super excited for our last week of the half term and all the fun it will bring!

Y2BB This week in 2BB, we have learned about limericks for national poetry day. We have read some different limericks and chosen our favourite one which we will learn and perform on Friday. We have also added and subtracted ones, made tens to support addition and used related facts in maths. In reading, we have read a poem about risk and continued to read our class book, The Tunnel. In geography, we created some information about London for a tour guide and we completed our collages of The Shard in art. Overall, another great week this week. Well done, everyone!

Y2LB We have had a busy week in 2LB. We have really enjoyed exploring limericks as part of our school poetry week and the children did an incredible job of performing their favourite limerick to the rest of the school! In maths, we have been learning to add by making 10. In music, we have combined all of the skills we have been developing over the term and performed our song... we had to sing and play our instruments at the same time! In art, we have started to explore how we can use charcoal as a drawing medium. It has been very messy but lots of fun! Have a fabulous weekend everyone!

Y5 Year five have had another excellent week at school. In writing, we have been writing Limerick poems as part of Delta's poetry week, and the children have come up with some hilarious examples! In addition to this, we have been working hard on some tricky multiplication and division problems in maths, as well as learning about what makes a capital city a capital city! Well done on a brilliant week year five and have a great weekend!

Y6 Despite the end of half term tiredness, year 6 have continued working their socks off across the entire curriculum. In maths, we have been finding equivalent fractions and then applying the skill to simplify fractions. In writing, we enjoyed performing some David Anderson poetry and then wrote our own limericks! In the wider curriculum, we learnt about climate zones and time zones, the architecture of different religious buildings and painted tonal gradients. Have a brilliant weekend and well done on another fantastic week in year 6!

FS2 We have had another fantastic week in FS2! We have continued reading 'Ollie's Lost Kitten', taking part in some drama activities and creating some brilliant pictures. We have innovated our class story map, changing the lost kitten to a lost pig, and we have each then created our own story map innovating the story ourselves. In maths we have been learning about 1 more and 1 less with numbers between 1-3, and we have been working hard in phonics learning some new phonemes. On Monday we celebrated 'Bring a stick to school day', where we turned our sticks into something different- we created magic wands, kites and pet dragons! Thank you to all the adults who attended our Stay and Play on Wednesday, we hope you had as much fun as we did!

Y1 Year 1 have been extremely busy this week, putting our acting skills to the test and learning a limerick for 'Poetry Week'. They practised and practised until they were ready to perform in assembly. Understandably they were all amazing! In Maths, we started to look addition and subtraction. We found out about the Whole Part Model and how numbers could be split into 2 parts. In Art, we learnt how to tear and cut materials to make different shapes. We then learnt how to layer materials. Finally, we applied all our skills and created a collage of a tree.

Y3 This week in Year Three, we tackled challenging subtraction problems in math and explored the art of writing limericks during Poetry Week. In our curriculum, we delved into Iron Age settlements and their use of moss. In art, we honed our skills using soft pastels to practice layering and adjusting tones, and in P.E., we all successfully learned how to skip. A huge well done to everyone!
